

## Trio: after an étude by Hélène de Montgeroult, composer\* for Terra Invisus

placing stones into still water

given timings are not strict; a stopwatch could be used but need not be, and longer versions adhering to roughly the same relative divisions are welcome piano: sustain pedal throughout; soft pedal throughout extremely soft—to a degree that the sounding of strings, and the balance between their sounding, is unpredictable in the hand repeating the given chord throughout, without pulse beginning very sparse—perhaps five chords in a minute, though never regular (00'00" – 02'40") becoming, almost imperceptibly, slightly less sparse—perhaps six chords in a minute, though still irregular (02'40" – 05'20") becoming, again, very sparse—perhaps five chords in a minute, though still irregular (05'20" – 08'00") never quite becoming silent bass clarinet; cello: very soft choosing from the given pitches freely, in the written register long tones with pause between beginning very sparse—perhaps only briefly overlapping, if ever (01'00" – 03'00") becoming, almost imperceptibly, slightly less sparse—perhaps overlapping more often, if at all; perhaps, once, long tones without pause between (03'00" – 05'00") becoming, again, very sparse—perhaps only briefly overlapping, if ever (05'00" – 07'00") general:
